CURFEW

§ 135-1. Curfew established; exceptions.

No person under the age of 18 years shall loiter in any public places between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 5:00 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, during the school year, vacation periods excepted, and between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 5:00 a.m. on all other days, nor shall any parent or guardian of such minor knowingly permit such minor to loiter in public places during such hours. This section does not apply to minors accompanied by a parent, guardian or person 18 years of age or older standing in loco parentis, when minors are performing an errand or duty directed by their parent or guardian or required by urgent necessity, when minors are pursuing duties of employment and when minors are going directly home from places of business or amusement or private homes.

§ 135-2. Authority of police. [Amended 10-13-1989]

Every member of the police force, while on duty, may detain any such minor violating the provisions of § 135-1 until the parent or guardian of the child shall take him or her into custody. Such officer shall immediately upon taking custody of the child communicate with the parent or guardian and shall comply with all other relevant provisions of Ch. 48, Wis. Stats.

§ 135-3. Violations and penalties. [Amended 7-9-1986]

The penalty for violation of any provision of this chapter shall be a penalty as provided in Chapter 1, § 1-4 of this Code.
