

Unapproved Minutes of the Regular Board Meeting

The Dickeyville Village Board met in regular session via zoom.com on February 10, 2021 at 6:00 p.m. by Zoom meeting

CALL TO ORDER: Meeting called to order at 6:00 p.m.

8. Jonathan Ackland came to talk to the board about a kennel Jon and his wife would like to start. The board would like Jonathan to talk to his neighbors about raising dogs in the neighborhood. The board does not have an issue with it as long as the neighbors are for it. The board thought the design they submitted was very nice. We will have this on the next board meeting.

9. MSA was not able to come to the meeting tonight. They will be at the meeting March 10, 2021.

10. Discussion and possible action on sidewalks in Dickeyville. There is nowhere to go with the snow in many places in Dickeyville. Residents shovel the sidewalks and then they plow and the snow goes right back on the sidewalks. Attorney Ben said we do have an ordinance in Dickeyville about cleaning sidewalks off and we need to follow the ordinance. Jay Redfern suggested that we eliminate sidewalks in the new subdivision. Attorney Ben will research sidewalks with the State.

11. PSC water rate increase. The board discussed the water rate increase of three percent (3%). We have not raised water rates in Dickeyville since 2002. PSC approved the increase. **MOTION:** Leibfried and T. George to raise the water rates by 3% starting in April 2021. Approved.

12. BUILDING PERMITS: Mike Reuter was not at meeting.

January was a very busy month for vehicle registrations, 50 plus. With all the snow, parking citations have been on the increase along with citizen complaints ref. snow plowing and neighbors snow. A citizen on West Main reported the rear window of a vehicle damaged by a possible BB Gun, (unknown suspect at this time.)

February 2, Dickeyville Police Department added a Part-time officer, Duane Jacobson, Duane is a full time Grant County Deputy. Duane will mostly be working weekend hours or as needed.

I have had a lot of request reference starting Bingo? Ideas, Thoughts? We will look at it again next month.

PUBLIC WORKS:

1. A crazy month. Luke and Dale had dinged a vehicle with the snow plow truck. Luke hit one on Plum Street and Dale hit one on N. Church Street. Accident claims have been taken care of.
2. Our first snowfall came on December 11th and through the month we measured 18 inches of snow. January has 25.5 inches of snow and so far in February 8 inches of snow. So far this winter that comes to 51.5 inches of snow or 4.3 feet. We have not had any warm days to melt any snow off. Looking at the snow along the streets you can tell.
3. Reasons why we try to plow close to the curb are: A. Storm sewers need to be open for when the snow does melt so water doesn't pond in the streets and freeze over. B. The room is needed for parking. Dale was mid-block on Rosalyn Street over this past weekend about 5:30 AM plowing where vehicles were moved. When vehicles are parked across from each other, there is not enough room to drive the plow through the remaining opening. Dale had to back up to the bank parking lot and turn around. If there would have been blowing snow this would have been very dangerous.
4. We are sure there are complaints that we drive too fast. Dale heard 40 MPH. The fastest speed Dale noticed is 17 MPH. If you don't have some momentum, the snow will fall back into the street because of the height of the snow banks.
5. MSA next month.

CLERK'S REPORT:

- Received many calls on when we will be opening up the Community Center gym. The board discussed this and they recommended opening up the Gym to 15 people or less. We will look at this issue as time goes on.
- Chris Pike wanted to know if the Village would have a place they could use for three (3) of there employees if need be. The Village would have the gym or Room A available if they need space.
- Ann Lucey's water bill was high this month because of her soft water unit. The board stated that we do not forgive on water usage.
