DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: The petition of Dale and Amy Ginter, owners of property located at 530 Church Street, Dickeyville, Wisconsin, requesting variances for:

- a. 14-foot left street yard setback variance from the required 20-foot street yard setback pursuant to Section 285-11(C)(4), to allow the proposed attached garage addition to be located 6 feet from the left street yard lot line/sidewalk. **MOTION: Wagner seconded by Bussan, to approve the 14-foot left street yard setback variance from the required 20-foot street yard setback.
