The Dickeyville Village Board met in regular session November 9, 2022 at 6:00 p.m. in the Dickeyville Community Center 500 East Avenue, Meeting Room A.

1. Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

5. Approve minutes of the October 12, 2022 Regular Board Meeting. MOTION: Kuepers and Ginter to approve the minutes from the October 12, 2022 meeting. APPROVED.

7. OLD BUSINESS:
8. BUILDING PERMITS: Mike Reuter, Discussion and possible action on an Ordinance for Commercial Buildings. Mike was unable to attend meeting and he would like to have this discussion moved to the January meeting. This will give him time to make sure everything is in order for the ordinance.
9. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Scott Wright would like to talk to the board about a donation for the Junior Bowling league again this year. Scott stated the Junior Bowling league is very grateful for the donations in the past years. 10. DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: Dickeyville Rescue Squad regarding budget. They would have to make 75% of the meetings and 75% percent of the training scheduled plus help with the events. They will not start this until January 2023. The Fire Marshall will be in town tomorrow to look over the scene. Hotel is shut down for now because they have no electricity.

- Wastewater Treatment Plant – Things are slowing down a little they are waiting for some electrical components that are hard to get right now. Everything is looking well.
- Industrial Park – Nick's Powersports water is not hooked up yet, Wiederholt will hook him up when time allows. There are no Street lights yet.
- New Well – Dale would be interested in #14 for the new well.
- Skid Steer update – Luke took the lawn mower just to see what it would be worth. At the present time the board would like to keep the lawn mower we have now and look at it later. The skid steer new date for arrival is in April is the release date.
